**Report on Comments Toward Development
of 2027 UPC, UMC Now Available for Online Download**

Ontario, Calif. (Aug. 1, 2025) — IAPMO®, developer of the *Uniform Plumbing Code (UPC®)* and *Uniform Mechanical Code (UMC®)*, has posted online the 2025 Report on Comments (ROC) for the 2027 editions of these American National Standard-designated model codes. The ROC includes the committee actions as discussed during the May 6-8 technical committee meetings, the electronic ballot results as balloted between May 19-June 16, and the Technical Correlating Committee actions on all comments received for the 2027 editions.
